Accepting our Responsibility as Disciples

1. PART I BASIC- Introduction: The Plumb Line. (1st Level): The Purpose of our Class. (A 12-level experience to help us meet the Standard of God- The Plumb Line.)

THE PLUMB LINE Class led by Pastor Troy:

The Plumb Line is a very special 12-week discipleship class designed by Pastor Troy aimed at building our Community of Faith toward its vision of growing faithful followers of Christ through Prayer, Outreach, Evangelism, Worship and Discipleship. In conversation with the elders, pastors & ministry staff, I have developed this special course which has been written just for our church family. We believe THE PLUMB LINE is a class that every single person in our church can grow from! We believe God will use it in PREPARING our church for a whole new level of ministry as a Community of Faith. Discipleship does not happen accidently but in an atmosphere where our spirit is challenged vertically according to God's Word both in a planned and intentional way. Our class is a 12-level experience at unlocking the standards God has for us and how we can measure up to the vertical challenge God has for us in growing into a Faithful Follower of Christ!

a. A Plumb Line- Explain

i. WORLD DEFINITION OF THE PLUMB LINE:

You may be asking '	"Just what is a Plumb line?"	

It has been used since very ancient times. A plumb line consists merely of a line and a weight of some sort, at first just a stone, but later a weight made from lead. Plumb lines were known to many people throughout Biblical History, including Jesus Christ who would have owned a set of various weights of them for His use in the building trade.

The weight is called the **plumb bob.** When suspended next to a workpiece it defines a vertical line- The "Plumb". The word comes from the Latin **plumbum**, or "lead," which is the material that replaced the original stone versions used to weight the bob or plummet.

The Plumb Line dates at least back to ancient Egypt. It was used by bricklayers, masons, and carpenters to make sure construction was done in a plumb or perfectly upright fashion.

Plumb bobs are also used in surveying and are used to set instruments exactly over a fixed datum marker. Up until our modern age great buildings were built using vertical datum lines or marks in the floor to keep the buildings plumb as they built upward.

Today you can still find brass datum marks inlaid on the floor of many great buildings signifying points builders used to keep great buildings, towers, domes, etc.... plumb as they were built.

ii. BIBLICAL DEFINITION OF THE PLUMB LINE:

The Hebrew word <u>misqelet</u> is translated "Plummet" in the King James or in most modern language Bibles as the "Plumb Line". We find this word used in 2 Kings 21:13, Isaiah 28:17, Amos 7:7-8 & Zachariah 4:10.

iii. CONNECTING IT TO THE WORD OF GOD AND GOD'S PLAN FOR US:

1. 2 Kings 21:13,

2 Kings 21:1-13 ncv

Manasseh was twelve years old when he became king, and he was king fifty-five years in Jerusalem. His mother's name was Hephzibah. ²He did what the LORD said was wrong. He did the hateful things the other nations had done— the nations that the LORD had forced out of the land ahead of the Israelites. ³Manasseh's father, Hezekiah, had destroyed the places where gods were worshiped, but Manasseh rebuilt them. He built altars for Baal, and he made an Asherah idol as Ahab king of Israel had done. Manasseh also worshiped all the stars of the sky and served them. ⁴The LORD had said about the Temple, "I will be worshiped in Jerusalem," but Manasseh built altars in the Temple of the LORD. ⁵He built altars to worship the stars in the two courtyards of the Temple of the LORD. ⁶He made his own son pass through fire. He practiced magic and told the future by explaining signs and dreams, and he got advice from mediums and fortune-tellers. He did many things the LORD said were wrong, which made the LORD angry.

⁷Manasseh carved an Asherah idol and put it in the Temple. The LORD had said to David and his son Solomon about the Temple, "I will be worshiped forever in this Temple and in Jerusalem, which I have chosen from all the tribes of Israel. ⁸I will never again make the Israelites wander out of the land I gave their ancestors. But they must obey everything I have commanded them and all the teachings my servant Moses gave them." ⁹But the people did not listen. Manasseh led them to do more evil than the nations the LORD had destroyed ahead of the Israelites. ¹⁰The LORD said through his servants the prophets, ¹¹"Manasseh king of Judah has done these hateful things. He has done more evil than the Amorites before him. He also has led Judah to sin with his idols. ¹²So this is what the LORD, the God of Israel, says: 'I will bring so much trouble on Jerusalem and Judah that anyone who hears about it will be shocked. ¹³ I will stretch the measuring line of Samaria over Jerusalem, and <u>the plumb line used against Ahab's family will be used on Jerusalem</u>. I will wipe out Jerusalem as a person wipes a dish and turns it upside down.

2. Isaiah 28:17,

Isaiah 28:16-17 nlt

Therefore, this is what the Sovereign LORD says: "Look! I am placing a foundation stone in Jerusalem. It is firm, a tested and precious cornerstone that is safe to build on. Whoever believes need never run away again.

¹⁷ "I will take the measuring line of justice and <u>the plumb line of righteousness</u> to check the foundation wall you have built. Your refuge looks strong, but since it is made of lies, a hailstorm will knock it down. Since it is made of deception, the enemy will come like a flood to sweep it away.

3. Amos 7:7-9

Amos 7:7-9 nlt A Vision of a Plumb Line

⁷ Then he showed me another vision. I saw the Lord standing beside a wall that had been built using a <u>plumb line</u>. He was checking it with <u>a plumb line to see if</u> <u>it was straight</u>. ⁸ And the LORD said to me, "Amos, what do you see?" I answered, "A plumb line."

And the Lord replied, "I will test my people with this plumb line. I will no longer ignore all their sins. ⁹ The pagan shrines of your ancestors and the temples of Israel will be destroyed, and I will bring the dynasty of King Jeroboam (King of Israel) to a sudden end." [()-my emphasis added]

4. Zech 4:10.

Zechariah 4:8-10 nlt

Then another message came to me from the LORD: ⁹ "Zerubbabel is the one who laid the foundation of this Temple, and he will complete it. Then you will know that the LORD Almighty has sent me. ¹⁰ Do not despise these small beginnings, for the LORD rejoices to see the work begin, to see the plumb line in Zerubbabel's hand. For these seven lamps represent the eyes of the LORD that search all around the world."

b. The Measuring Tool of a DISCIPLE- Define Disciple!

The Plumb Line is God's Standard for our Righteousness or Holiness- which means our walk according to the Lord's Holy Way for His People! As I said earlier: I have designed the PLUMB LINE CLASS to cover what every Biblically Functioning Faithful Follower of Jesus Christ needs to know to be an effective Disciple.

But this means we must also define **DISCIPLE!** It is a noun which means: one who accepts and assists in spreading the doctrines of another, in this case, the doctrines of Jesus Christ. A disciple is someone who is "a convinced adherent of a school or individual."


It is important to note the two-sided responsibility of a disciple. They the doctrine

AND they

the doctrine. As a modern church we are failing horribly at the latter half of this two-sided responsibility, and we are very marginal in meeting the "Plumb" of the former.

Remember in a VERTICLE STRUCTURE there are two axis's the E-W and N-S.

We as disciples must have both Axis's aligned to be "Plumb."



In our faith, it was the Disciples whom Jesus first called who became students of his ministry. At first the Twelve Apostles and then the numbers expanded to the 70 and to many more as the faith spread. In the Book of Acts many followers begin to call themselves disciples, and eventually take the name "Christians", first at Antioch. (Acts 11:26)

Acts 11:25-26 nlt

²⁵Then Barnabas went on to Tarsus to find Saul. ²⁶When he found him, he brought him back to Antioch. Both of them stayed there with the church for a full year, teaching great numbers of people. (It was there at Antioch that the believers *(Grk- mathētēs, math-ay-tes' or disciples)* were first called Christians.)

Nelsons Bible Commentary Tells us:

"The believers were **called Christians** because they worshiped Christ, the Messiah. The historian Josephus called them "that tribe of Christians." Tacitus, the Roman historian, referred to them as "Christians, a name derived from Christ." Originally, the church called themselves "The Way." But later they began to refer to themselves as Christians, despite the fact that the name most likely was originally used to ridicule the believers.¹"

The word	today is used as a way of self-
identification for those who seek to learn from the life of Jesus	and follow in His footsteps.
The teachings of Jesus and the history of the early church recor	ds in the four gospels and the
Book of Acts the use of the word "Disciple" some 232 times!	

One could easily conclude that Volume 1: The Gospels and Volume 2: The Book of Acts—<u>is</u>
the discipleship training manual for the followers of Jesus!

i. That foundation is ______.

Ephesians 2:19-22 nlt

So now you Gentiles are no longer strangers and foreigners. You are citizens along with all of God's holy people. You are members of God's family. ²⁰ We are his house, built on the foundation of the apostles and the prophets. **And the cornerstone is**Christ Jesus himself. ²¹ We who believe are carefully joined together, becoming a holy temple for the Lord. ²² Through him you Gentiles are also joined together as part of this dwelling where God lives by his Spirit.

1 Corinthians 3:10-13 nlt

Because of God's special favor to me, I have laid the foundation like an expert builder. Now others are building on it. But whoever is building on this foundation must be very careful.

11 For no one can lay any other foundation than the one we already have—Jesus Christ.
12 Now anyone who builds on that foundation may use gold, silver, jewels, wood, hay, or straw.

Let's take a look at just a few text that introduce The Plumb Line itself- The Master Builder- (Other text you might browse: Romans 1:20 & Proverbs 8:22-30)

• Genesis 1- The Old Testament Declares God is the Master Builder!

Genesis 1:1-3 & 26 nlt

In the beginning <u>God created the heavens and the earth.</u> ² The earth was empty, a formless mass cloaked in darkness. And <u>the Spirit of God was hovering over its surface.</u> ³ Then God said, "Let there be light," and there was light... ²⁶Then <u>God said, "Let us make people in our image, to be like ourselves.</u> They will be masters over all life—the fish in the sea, the birds in the sky, and all the livestock, wild animals, and small animals."

ii. Nelson's OPEN BIBLE (NASB pg.904)

GOD

The Bible reveals God as the only INFINITE and ETERNAL BEING, having no beginning and no ending. He is CREATOR and SUSTAINER of all things. He is the SUPREME PERSONAL INTELLIGENCE, and RIGHTEOUS RULER OF HIS UNIVERSE. He is LIFE and therefore, the ONLY SOURCE OF LIFE.... In the Old Testament He revealed Himself to and through His prophets. In the New Testament He reveals Himself through His Son Jesus Christ.

iii. John Wesley wrote a great statement on who God is in the Holy Trinity in his Article 1 for the Articles of Religion for the people called Methodist:

Article 1- Of Faith in the Holy Trinity

"There is but one living and true God, everlasting, without body or parts, of infinite power, wisdom, and goodness; the maker and preserver of all things, both visible and invisible. And in unity of this Godhead there are three persons, of one substance, power, and eternity-the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost." (Article 1 from John Wesley's articles of religion for the people called Methodist)

- **b.** The Bible indicates 3 Characteristics that are central to the "WHO" of God:
 - i. God is ______. God is love, and all who live in love live in God, and God lives in them. (1 John 4:16b)

1 John 4:11-17 nlt

- ¹¹ Dear friends, since God loved us that much, we surely ought to love each other. ¹² No one has ever seen God. But if we love each other, God lives in us, and his love has been brought to full expression through us.
- ¹³ And God has given us his Spirit as proof that we live in him and he in us. ¹⁴ Furthermore, we have seen with our own eyes and now testify that the Father sent his Son to be the Savior of the world. ¹⁵ All who proclaim that Jesus is the Son of God have God living in them, and they live in God. ¹⁶ We know how much God loves us, and we have put our trust in him.

God is love, and all who live in love live in God, and God lives in them. ¹⁷ And as we live in God, our love grows more perfect. So we will not be afraid on the day of judgment, but we can face him with confidence because we are like Christ here in this world.

2. The _____ OF GOD. (Romans 9:14-24)

¹⁶ So receiving God's promise is not up to us. We can't get it by choosing it or working hard for it. God will show mercy to anyone he chooses.



This diagram illustrates that God is holy and people are sinful. A great gulf separates us. The arrows illustrate that we are continually trying to reach God and the abundant life through our own efforts, such as a good life, philosophy, or religion -- but we inevitably fail.

"God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us."



Receiving Christ involves turning to God from self (repentance) and trusting Christ to come into our lives to forgive our sins and to make us what He wants us to be. Just to agree intellectually that Jesus Christ is the Son of God and that He died on the cross for your sins is not enough. Nor is it enough to have an emotional experience. You receive Jesus Christ by faith, as an act of the will.

And it begins with one simple action which brings an incredible transformation- Acts 3:19 nkjv

C. Becoming a Part of the Plan:

ii. The Four Spiritual Laws: You can receive Christ right now by faith through prayer. Prayer is talking to God. God knows your heart and is not so concerned with your words as He is with the attitude of your heart. *The following is a suggested prayer:*

"Lord Jesus, I need You. Thank You for dying on the cross for my sins. I open the door of my life and receive You as my Savior and Lord. Thank You for forgiving my sins and giving me eternal life. Take control of the throne of my life. Make me the kind of person You want me to be."

iii. The Roman Road: Are You Ready to Accept God's Gift of Salvation? The following is a suggested prayer:

"Father, I know that I have broken your laws and my sins have separated me from you. I am truly sorry, and now I want to turn away from my past sinful life toward you. Please forgive me, and help me avoid sinning again. I believe that your son, Jesus Christ died for my sins, was resurrected from the dead, is alive, and hears my prayer. I invite Jesus to become the Lord of my life, to rule and reign in my heart from this day forward. Please send your Holy Spirit to help me obey You, and to do Your will for the rest of my life. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen."

Father, Forgive me for placing myself before you. I repent of my sins, I invite your Son Jesus to be the Lord of My life, and I put my whole trust in you. I place my life in your hands. The text was originally initiated to act as a litmus test against the infiltration of **Gnosticism or Marcionism** into the early church.

- The Gnostics- Does not except Jesus dualism, but only that he was the Son of God who assumed a ghost like phantasmal human experiencing, and could have never been crucified, let alone dead and buried. They were into Gnosis or divine enlightenment of knowledge.
- The Marcionist Marcion of Sinope at Rome (144 A.D.) believed only in a Gospel of Love, he deleted the OT from the biblical cannon. The God of the OT, the God of Law, was a different and lesser God than the God of the NT, the God of Jesus thus the God of Love. The creed has since been able to stand up as a clear detector of all quasi-Christian and cultic sects since. He accepted 10 of the 24 chapters of Luke and 10 of Paul's Epistles to be his canon.

In an effort to define the basic elements of the Christianity around 150AD the basis of The Apostles' Creed then called "The Symbol of Faith" was established. To affirm this creed prevented those with Gnostic or Marcionist theologies from entering the community of Christian Faith. In the baptisms of Christians having gone through a 3-year period of Confirmation it was used originally as a series of 3 questions. The confirmand was immersed after each of the three questions and answers were given. Its title is first found in a letter of St., Ambrose in 390AD., by which time the legend of its joint composition by the Apostles was current. By the early Middle Ages, it was used throughout in Christian Baptism. By the 7th & 9th century it secured a place in the daily offices, it is found in the Book of Common Prayer and is used to this day as one of the oldest and most historical professions of the Christian Faith.

The Details of The Atonement:

In His death on the cross, Jesus Christ fulfilled and replaced the Old Testament sacrificial system. He offered up Himself as the supreme, once-for-all <u>sacrifice</u> of <u>atonement</u> through the shedding of his <u>blood</u>. By Jesus' one act of righteousness, <u>salvation</u> as a free gift is for all who <u>believe & confess Him as Savior & Lord</u>.

The Resurrection can pertain to that of, The Christ, on that first Easter Morning or to the Resurrection of the dead at the second coming. In reference to the first, it is a fundamental base of Christianity, without which Christian doctrine and Scripture becomes a word without integrity. This is testified to by its inclusion in the Apostles' Creed, one of the earliest formulas used for admission into the Christian community. It is the very basis of Christian preaching that as Christ was resurrected we might also be born again. It

is the belief that Christ himself bore the sin of the world, died upon the cross, was buried, and on the third day took up his life again that we might know that the promises of God and the forgiveness of sin was in his power to give. In reference to the second, the Resurrection of the dead, it is also a fundamental base of Christianity. Again it, as well as the next doctrine, "eternal life", are noted by their inclusion in the last line of the Apostles' Creed, "the resurrection of the body and life everlasting." The resurrection of the body is the Christian belief that at the Parousia² (par-oo-see'-ah) those saints having died, and those that are living, shall enter into a new heavenly body for eternity.

ARTICLE IV from Constitution of Community of Faith

ARTICLE IV – STATEMENT OF FAITH

The core beliefs of Community of Faith Church are grounded in Biblical truth and summed up by the "Apostles' Creed".

The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; He descended into hell, the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sitteth at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church***, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

***The holy Catholic Church is a traditional statement. This is not a reference to the Roman Catholic denomination. Rather, it refers to the Unified body of Christ as seen in scripture. The word "catholic" means united.

Summary of our Core Beliefs:

The Trinity/Triune God: God is THREE in ONE- Father, Son & Holy Spirit.

God as Father: God is Father Almighty, Creator of the Universe.

God as Son: Jesus Christ is fully human and fully God, having been conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. Jesus lived a sinless life and offered himself as the perfect sacrifice for the sins of all people by dying on the cross. He died on the cross, the complete and final sacrifice for our sins according to the Word. Further, He arose bodily from the dead, ascended into heaven, where, at the right hand of the Father He is both our High Priest, Advocate and Judge.

God as Holy Spirit: The Holy Spirit is present in the world to make men aware of their need for Jesus. He also lives in every Christian from the moment of salvation. He provides the Christian with power for living through the spiritual gifts, and the understanding of spiritual truth and guidance in doing what is right. As Christians, we seek to live under His control daily.

Free Will: The gift offered by God's Prevenient Grace that allows all humans to reject or accept His plan for our life.

Original Sin: Man was created in the image of God but fell into sin and is therefore lost, and only through atonement and regeneration by the Holy Spirit can man be saved and receive the spiritual life God offers to all who call Him Lord & Savior.

The Atonement: Comes in Jesus Christ who became the final Passover Lamb offering Himself, a lamb without blemish, offering His blood and life as the only acceptable offering to God for the sin debt of humanity both original and actual.

The Resurrection: The triumph of Jesus over the Grave, which promises the believers triumph over the Grave.

Justification by Faith: The Shed blood of Jesus Christ and His resurrection provide the only ground for justification and salvation for all who believe, and only such as receive Jesus Christ by faith are born of the Holy Spirit and thus become children of God into eternal life. By our justification we join the Priesthood of all Believers (1 Peter 2:9, Revelations 1:6) and our commissioned to take the Good News to the World (Matthew 28:18-20).

The Word of God: The Bible, the Scriptures, both Old & New Testament are the Written Word of God. It was written by human authors, under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. It is the supreme source of truth for Christian beliefs and living. Because it is inspired by God it is the truth without any mixture or error in its original writings. It is the complete revelation of God's will for the Church. It is the divine and final authority for all Christian faith and life. Where it speaks God is calling us to listen and obey.


The Church: The Church is composed of all such persons (Biblically Functioning Faithful Followers) who through saving faith in Jesus Christ, have been regenerated by the Holy Spirit and are united together in the body of Christ of which Jesus is the head. WE BELIEVE:

Additional Theological & Biblical Reference to our Core Beliefs:

- 1. God, the Father: God, assisted by Jesus and the Holy Spirit, made the heavens and the earth. He is referred to by Jesus as Father and by Paul as Abba. He is the giver of every good and perfect gift. Genesis 1:1; Psalms 68: 5; Isaiah 64:8; Matthew 6:9-13; Matthew 26:39; Romans 8:15; James 1:17.
- 2. The Person and Work of Christ: The Lord Jesus, the Christ, and the eternal Son of God, became man without ceasing to be God, having been conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary, in order that He might reveal God and redeem sinful man. He accomplished our redemption through His death on the cross as a substitutionary sacrifice. Our redemption and salvation are guaranteed to us by His physical resurrection from the dead. Luke 1:38; John 1:1, 14 and 18; Romans 3:24-26; I Corinthians 15:4; Colossians 1:15-20; I John 2:2.
- 3. The Personality of the Holy Spirit: The Holy Spirit is a person who convicts the world of sin, righteousness and judgment, regenerates believers in Christ, sets each member in the Body of Christ, the church; indwells them, seals them unto the day of redemption, teaches all truth and bestows spiritual gifts upon each saved believer. Jesus baptizes and fills with the Holy Spirit those yielded to Him. John 15:26; 16:7-15; I Corinthians 12:4-13; Ephesians 4:30; 5:18; I John 2:27.
- 4. <u>Holy Scriptures</u>: The Holy Bible, as set out in the original manuscripts, is the verbally inspired Word of God; authoritative, inerrant, and God-breathed. Matthew 5: 18; II Timothy 3:16-17; II Peter 1:20-21.
- 5. <u>Holiness</u>: God has called Christians out of the kingdom of darkness into the kingdom of light from sin to holiness. It is God's will that we partake of His nature and escape the corruption that is in the world. Matthew 5:48; John 8:1-11; II Corinthians 7:1; Ephesians 4:24; Hebrews 12:14; I Peter 1:16; II Peter 1:4.
- 6. <u>Salvation</u>: Salvation is a gift of God through grace and is received by man through personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ whose precious blood was shed for the forgiveness of our sins. John 1:12; Romans 3:25-26; II Corinthians 5:21; Ephesians 1:7; 2:8-9; Titus 3:5.
- 7. <u>The New Creation</u>: God's masterful work of creating the universe by His Word is exceeded only by the greatest masterpiece of His workmanship, namely, a Christian. Becoming a new creation helps us

- to face life knowing that our identification with Christ enables us to hold fast to our confession, overcome in life and be more than conquerors in Christ. II Corinthians 5:17; Galatians 6:15; Ephesians 2:10; 4:24.
- 8. The Total Depravity of Man: Man was created in the image and likeness of God, but through Adam's sin, the human race fell. Man inherited a sinful nature and became alienated from God. Man is totally unable to regain his former position by or through his own means. Genesis 1:26; 3:1-24; 6:5; Psalms 53:3; Romans 3:23; 5:12; Ephesians 2:12; I John 1:8.
- 9. **The Church:** The Lord Jesus is the Head of the Church, which is composed of all His true disciples, and in Him is vested all the power for its government. According to His commandments, Christians are to associate themselves into communities of local churches. God admonishes His people to assemble regularly for worship. God still heals, delivers, and works miracles through His church. Deuteronomy 12: 5-7; Isaiah 53:5; John 14:12-14; I Corinthians 12:12-13; Ephesians 1:22-23; 5:25-27; Hebrews 10:25; 13:8; James 5:14-15; I Peter 2:24.
- 10. The Head of the Church: The Head of the Church is Christ Himself. He is the final and ultimate authority in all matters of faith, doctrine, and decision. All divinely approved church practices in the New Testament reflect the Church's own acknowledgement of God's hand directing the Church. Where the Church failed to submit itself to Christ, He spoke firmly and unequivocally in denunciation. He expresses His will today through the Holy Spirit and the written Word. Matthew 11:27; 28:18; John 5:27; 14:16-18 and 26; 16:13-14; 17:2; Acts 13:2-4; 14:26-27; Ephesians 1:22-23; 5:23; Colossians 1:18; Revelation 2 and 3.
- 11. **Baptism:** Baptism is an ordinance of the Lord Jesus, obligatory upon every believer, wherein he is immersed in water as a sign of his fellowship with the death and resurrection of Christ; of remission of sins and of his giving himself up to God, and to live and walk in newness of life. It is not a prerequisite to salvation. Matthew 3:6-8; Mark 1:5, 9 and 15; Luke 3:3-16; Acts 8:38-39; Romans 6:4-5; Colossians 2:12.
- 12. <u>The Lord's Day</u>: The Lord's Day is a Christian institution for regular observance and should be employed in exercise of worship and spiritual devotion. Exodus 20:8-11; Matthew 12:1-12; Mark 2:27-28; I Corinthians 16:1-2; Colossians 2:16; 3:16; Revelation 1:10.
- 13. <u>The Lord's Supper</u>: The Lord's Supper is an ordinance of Jesus Christ, to be administered with the elements of bread and juice of grapes; and to be observed by His Church until the end of the world. It is in no sense a sacrifice but is designed to commemorate His death and our communion with Him and with our church fellowship. It is open to all believers. Matthew 26:26-28; I Corinthians 11:23-26.
- 14. <u>Citizenship</u>: Civil government is of divine appointment and established by God for the good order of human society. Government officials are to be prayed for and obeyed except in things opposed to the will of our Lord Jesus Christ. Isaiah 9:6-7; Mark 12:13-17; Romans 13:1-7.
- 15. <u>Marriage</u>: The first institution that God gave mankind was marriage. He joined a man and a woman in a special and sacred union. To this union He gave a special gift sexuality. This gift expressed in any other form (example: fornication, adultery, homosexuality, transsexuality, or bestiality) does not have God's approval. Genesis 2:18-25; 3:16; 4:1; Exodus 20:14 and 17; Song of Solomon; Matthew 19:1-6; Ephesians 5:22-31; Revelation 19:7-9.
- 16. <u>The Responsibility of Believers</u>: All believers should seek to walk by the Spirit, not bringing reproach upon their Lord and Savior. It is the obligation of every believer to witness by life and by word to the truths of the Holy Scripture and seek to proclaim the Gospel to the entire world. Romans 12:1-2; Galatians 5:16 and 25; II Corinthians 6:14; 7:1; Acts 1:8; Matthew 28:16-20.
- 17. **Sanctity of Life:** All human life was created by God and should be valued. The valueless ending of human life is not approved of by Him. Abortion and euthanasia are not acceptable means of dealing with life's difficulties. Exodus 20:13; II Peter 3:19.
- 18. **Stewardship:** God is the source of all blessings, temporal and spiritual. All we have and are we owe to Him. We recognize the Lord as owner of all our possessions. Christians cheerfully, regularly, systematically, proportionately, and liberally should contribute their talents, abilities and possessions to advancing the Savior's cause on earth. The purpose of the tithe is to enable us to discharge some of

- the tremendous sense of obligation and indebtedness we have toward God and to teach us to always put God first in our lives. Deuteronomy 14:23; Leviticus 27:30-32; Malachi 3:8-12; Matthew 6:1-4 and 19-21; Luke 12:16-21; Acts 2:44-47; Romans 6:6-22; I Corinthians 4:1-2; Philippians 4:10-19; I Peter 1:18-19.
- 19. <u>Last Things</u>: At the end of the age, every person will be judged. The unrighteous will go to Hell, a place of everlasting punishment. The righteous, through Christ, will receive their reward and dwell forever in Heaven with the Lord. Matthew 25:31-46; Luke 16:19-31; John 14:1-3; Revelation 19-22.
- 20. <u>The Second Coming of Christ</u>: Jesus will return personally and visibly to the earth according to His promise. Believers are to live sensible, righteous, and godly lives in the present age looking for His imminent return. Matthew 24:27-44; Titus 2:12-13.



1.	(33-312 AD): This is the first
	period in the history of the Church of Jesus Christ. It is ushered
	in beginning in Acts 2:1 in Jerusalem in the Upper Room, on the
	Day the Jews celebrated the first Pentecost after Jesus' death.
	On this day the Holy Spirit was poured out on the Church of
	Jesus Christ, and it was endued with the power to become His
	Presence and Commissioned for His "Gospel Mission" to the

Acts 2:1-4 *nkjv*

When the Day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. ²And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³Then there appeared to them divided tongues, as of fire, and *one* sat upon each of them. ⁴And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.

Key events in the Apostolic Age:

- The Ministry of the Apostles and their disciples.
- The Early Development of the Apostles Creed as the Symbol of Faith for Baptism in 150 A.D.
- The early church fathers of Ignatius, Clement of Rome, Justin Martyr, Tertullian, Polycarp, Irenaeus, Origen, and Tertullian.

2. ______(313-603): This is the second major period in the age of the church, when it moved from being the persecuted minority and intolerant faith of the Christians to becoming the tolerated faith of the state. This begins with the Emperor Constantine who in 313 A.D. had a vision from the Lord.

It was October, 312 AD Constantine and his troops marched toward Rome to do battle with his opponent, another would-be emperor, the tyrannical Maxentius. It was the greatest challenge the gifted young general had ever faced. The stakes were high: Who would control the mightiest empire that had ever appeared up to that time on the face of earth?

As Constantine stopped to consider his battle plans, he realized he needed greater power than just military force. Maxentius was relying on magical enchantments. But how should Constantine pray? His father was a monotheist, believing there was only one God over all. Constantine saw that the pagan gods failed to protect their worshipers. So he sought his father's God in prayer, pleading for him to tell him who he was and to stretch forth his hand to help him. As he prayed (it was a little after noon), Constantine had an absorbing vision. He saw the sign of the cross emblazoned across the sky and the words In hoc signo vinces, "In this sign you will win."

Constantine was struck with amazement, along with his whole army (which also witnessed the miracle). That night in his sleep it was confirmed: this was the Christ of God he was dealing with. So went the report of Eusebius.

Constantine accepted the vision. He adopted the sign. He had the cross inscribed on his soldiers' armor. He went into battle. Even though his forces were outnumbered, he won. *Taken from Christian History Timeline @ www.christianhistorytimeline.com- Glimpses #12: A Vision of Triumph; Constantine Wins the Day for Christianity.

Christianity becomes the in thing and becomes institutionalized. During this period the church developed into two main centers the East led by the Church of Constantinople, Antioch, Alexandria and Jerusalem and the West led by the Bishop of Rome. There were lots of theological challenges by off-shoots during this age like Nestorians (d.428) who saw Son of God and Son of Man as two different people in one, a more intense Gnostic concept. Also, Pelagianism (d.420) who argued that salvation comes by man's first steps apart from divine grace and he denied original sin. There were many other derivatives.

Key events in the State Church Age:

- Constantine's vision and conversion in 312 A.D.
- The Council of Nicaea was led by Athanasius in 325 which produced the Nicene Creed.

The issues of Nicaea boil down to this. If Christ is not God, how can he overcome the infinite gap between God and man? If a created being could do it, there were angels aplenty with the power. Indeed, why could not any good man himself bridge the gap? On the other hand, Jesus had to be truly man, otherwise how could he represent mankind?

At some point the council decided their best course was to write a creed that testified to what they believed. The creed of Nicaea became a document of fundamental importance to the church. That so many of the bishops who approved it had suffered greatly for Christ only added to its significance. The council itself was a forerunner to many more, some international, some regional. Those councils which came after also grappled with issues of Christ's humanity and deity. Was he one person or two? Was he God while in his mother's womb? Did he have just one will? Which books belong in the Bible? The seventh ecumenical church council was also held at Nicaea.

THE NICENE CREED OF 325

We believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the son of God, begotten of the Father [the only-begotten; that is, of the essence of the Father, God of God], Light of Light, very God of very God; begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father; By whom all things were made [both in heaven and on earth]; Who, for us men, and for our salvation, came down and was incarnate and was made man; He suffered, and the third day he rose again, ascended into heaven; From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

And in the Holy Ghost. Amen.

- Other great leaders of the Church: Augustine of Hippo (354-430), Athanasius and the Creed of Christ (356).
- 2nd Council of Constantinople. (553).
- Gregory the Great becomes a Reluctant Pontiff and begins to separate the Catholic Church from the State. A Papal Church is born.

3. _____ which includes the Dark Ages (604-1517):

The Bishop of Rome, in 604, becomes the Papal Supremacy, Gregory the Great. He basically pulls away from control from state control and the Church becomes an institution of itself. This age included the rise of Islam 570-632 with the life of Mohammed. It is marked by the West and East Church coming to the great divide between Roman Catholics. The main issues were over the papal claims and *Filioque-and the Son-* the double procession of the Holy Spirit from both the Father and Son. In 589 the 3rd Council of Toledo changed the Nicene Creed to read: "And in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, and giver of life, who from the Father and the son proceeds." The Eastern church disagreed with the double procession. From here Roman Catholicism and Eastern Orthodoxy began taking different roads until 1054.

THE GREAT SCHISM July 6,1054 SCHISM BETWEE EAST AND WEST BEGINS!

The break came when Michael Cerularius was Patriarch of Constantinople and St. Leo pope in Rome. In 1053, Cerularius circulated a treatise criticizing in strong terms the practices of the Western church. Catholics did not allow their clergy to marry. This was contrary to scripture and tradition, said Cerularius. And Catholics used unleavened bread in their Eucharist. But the most serious concern was that the Latin church had added the word "filiogue" to the Nicene creed, saying the Holy Spirit proceeded from both Father and Son.

It would seem that this was more political to Leo than religious, as it was pressed upon him by the Franks. Cerularius excommunicated all bishops of Constantinople who used the Western ritual and closed down their churches. This incensed Leo. He demanded that Cerularius submit to the pope. Any church which refused to recognize the pontiff as supreme was an assembly of heretics, he said--a synagogue of Satan. The Eastern patriarch wasn't about to accept this characterization. The five patriarchs, Antioch, Jerusalem, Alexandria, Constantinople and Rome were equals in his eyes. The bishop of Rome, as patriarch of the West, was given the courtesy title of "first among equals" and in a tie vote he could make the final determination according to tradition. Rome's growing claims to authority were deemed unacceptable to the other patriarchs, who believed (and who still believe) that Christ alone is the head of the church. * Christian History Timeline at www.christianhistorytimeline.com Schism between East and West Began.

Finally, this period includes the dark ages, the crusades, and the fall of Jerusalem from Christian control in 1291, after many years of crusade battles against the Turks. Constantinople was finally captured by Moslems in 1453, which is the fall of the Byzantine Empire.

4. **(1517-1700)** In 1517 a

young German priest/monk Martin Luther protests against the corruption of Rome and the abuses taking place through the sale of indulgences. In response to his protest Luther drew up 95 Thesis against indulgences and nailed them to the door of the Schlosskirche Castle (Castle Church) at Wittenberg. It was the second most famous nailing in Christian history and the shot heard around the world. It led to the Protestant Reformation and break off from the Catholic Church. It was fueled by other such schisms taking place across Europe. Other Radical Reformers begin to break away forming Anabaptist, Congregationalist, Mennonites, Amish and more. The Swiss Reformer- Ulrich Zwingli (1522) pulls away. John Calvin and The Reformed Tradition begins its reform in Geneva. Calvin is most famous for his TULIP acronym. Finally in 1534 with different motives England under Henry VIII has the Bishop of Canterbury succeed. The Church of England draws up their own Book of Common Prayer and formally separates from the Roman church over the issue of political-spiritual control and a monarchial divorce. In the new Anglican Church the King is the Spiritual leader replacing Papal authority. The last major move was the Remonstrance of 1610, this was in response to Calvinism. Led by Dutch Reformer Jakob Arminius, the movement stood against the doctrine of predestination. The Arminians insisted that the Divine sovereignty was compatible with a real free will in man; that Christ died for all men and not only forth elect; and that predestination was unbiblical. The Holiness/Pietistic movement springs partly from this lineage. No one has had more of an influence on the formation of our modern protestant theology today than the Arminian argument. Now let's back up and look at Calvin's TULIP and the Arminian and Lutheran differences in the family of the Great Protestant Reformers.

TULIP- CLASSIC 5 POINT CALVINISM

The five points therefore function as a summary of the differences between Calvinism and Arminianism, but not as a complete summation of Calvin's writings or of the theology of the Reformed churches in general. In English, they are sometimes referred to by the <u>acronym</u> TULIP(see below), though this puts them in a different order than the <u>Canons of Dort</u>. The central assertion of these canons is that God is able to save every person upon whom he has mercy and that his efforts are not frustrated by the unrighteousness or the inability of humans.

- "Total depravity": This doctrine, also called "total inability," asserts that as a consequence of the <u>fall of man into sin</u>, every person born into the world is enslaved to the service of <u>sin</u>. People are not by nature inclined to love God with their whole heart, mind, or strength, but rather all are inclined to serve their own interests over those of their neighbor and to reject the rule of God. Thus, all people by their own faculties are morally unable to choose to follow God and be saved because they are unwilling to do so out of the necessity of their own natures. (The term "total" in this context refers to sin affecting every part of a person, not that every person is as evil as possible.)
- "<u>Unconditional election</u>": This doctrine asserts that God's choice from <u>eternity</u> of those whom he will bring to himself is not based on foreseen virtue, merit, or faith in those people. Rather, it is unconditionally grounded in God's mercy alone.
- "Limited atonement": Also called "particular redemption" or "definite atonement," this doctrine asserts that Jesus's <u>substitutionary atonement</u> was definite and certain in its design and accomplishment. This implies that only the sins of <u>the elect</u> were <u>atoned</u> for by Jesus's death. Calvinists do not believe, however, that the atonement is limited in its value or power (in other words, God could have elected everyone and used it to atone for them all), but rather that the atonement is limited in the sense that it is designed for some and not all. Hence, Calvinists hold that the atonement is sufficient for all and efficient for the elect. The doctrine is driven by the Calvinistic concept of the sovereignty of God in salvation and their understanding of the nature of the atonement.
- "Irresistible grace": This doctrine, also called "efficacious grace," asserts that the saving grace of God is effectually applied to those whom he has determined to save (that is, the elect) and, in God's timing, overcomes their resistance to obeying the call of the gospel, bringing them to a saving faith. This means that when God sovereignly purposes to save someone, that individual certainly will be saved. The doctrine holds that every influence of God's Holy Spirit cannot be resisted, but that the Holy Spirit, "graciously causes the elect sinner to cooperate, to believe, to repent, to come freely and willingly to Christ."
- "Perseverance of the saints": Perseverance (or preservation) of the saints (The word "saints" is used in the Biblical sense to refer to all who are set apart by God, and not in the technical sense of one who is exceptionally holy, canonized, or in heaven). The doctrine asserts that since God is sovereign and his will cannot be frustrated by humans or anything else, those whom God has called into communion with himself will continue in faith until the end. Those who apparently fall away either never had true faith to begin with or will return. * added-- Also known as "Once saved always Saved."

5. (1700-1904): This age follows with a strong refinement of the Arminian Spirit fused with the Puritan Heart for God. The great leaders of this age are the *Moravians* with Count Von Zinzendorf and the Moravian Revival, John Wesley and the *Methodist Movement*, which leads later to the, Missions conscious *Salvation Army* led by

William Booth 1861, and also *The Holiness Church* with its Wesleyan connection and leanings on perfection. From there springs forth the Nazarene off-shoots which heads us right toward the birth of Pentecostalism. During this time protestant Gospel work emerges all over China, Asia, and Africa. It is a new age as the Holiness period leads to a new missionary age, unknown since the age of the Apostles.

6. ______ & _____ (1904-1968):

The Azusa Street Revival was a historic Pentecostal revival meeting that took place in Los Angeles, California, and was led by William J. Seymour, an African American preacher. It began with a meeting on April 14, 1906, and continued until roughly 1915. The revival was characterized by ecstatic spiritual experiences accompanied by speaking in tongues, dramatic worship services, and inter-racial mingling. The participants received criticism from secular media and Christian theologians for behaviors considered to be outrageous and unorthodox, especially at the time. Today, the revival is considered by historians to be the primary catalyst for the spread of Pentecostalism in the 20th century. Seymour and the other revivalists at the Apostolic Faith Mission on Azusa Street held to five core beliefs:

- 1. Salvation by Faith.
- 2. Sanctification (or Holiness) of the believer.
- 3. Tongues as evidence of Baptism with the Holy Spirit.
- 4. Faith healing as part of God's redemption.
- 5. The "very soon" return of Christ.

Doctrinal differences abounded, and many separate organizations and denominations sprung from the initial revivals. The Church of God in Christ was formed in 1907, the Assemblies of God and United Pentecostal Church were

formed in 1914, the <u>Pentecostal Church of God</u> was formed in 1919 at the Sharon Bible School.

Today, there are more than 500 million Pentecostal and charismatic believers across the globe. The Pentecostal denomination is currently second in size behind the **Roman** Catholic Church and is the fastest-growing form of Christianity today. The Azusa Street Revival is commonly regarded as the beginning of the modern-day Pentecostal Movement.

The Pentecostal Movement birthed in the 1906-1909 revival at Azusa Street Mission was "the logical outcome of the holiness crusade which had vexed American Protestantism...and the Methodist Church." It was "the child of the holiness movement" and the grandchild of Methodism. "Practically all the early Pentecostal leaders were firm advocates of sanctification as a 'second work of grace' and...added" Holy Ghost baptism as a "third blessing". *Quotes taken from Regent University School of Divinity Processor on Church History Dr. Vinson Synan.

7. _________(1969-Present): In 1969 the Pentecostal Movement has a revival among the laity. The Charismatic Renewal started within the Roman Catholic Church and worked its way into the Protestant Churches, particularly reigniting the Holiness movement to a whole new level. It also produced numerous streams of new local and independent churches around the world, particularly in America.





2. LET'S LOOK AT THE WHOLE ACTS PICTURE:

In Acts 2:1: We see 120 people filled with the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. By the end of that day some 3000 people had given their life to Christ and were filled with the Power of God.

And it was just beginning. In the next day's many, many more are converted.

The Gospel starts burning in CHAPTERS 1-7 of Acts and quickly begins to move throughout Judea and into Samaria by Acts 8-9 and by Acts 10 it is burning through the world moving from the Hebrews to the Gentiles and from Jerusalem all the way to ROME!

In Acts 3: Peter and the Disciples begin Preaching and sharing the Gospel. Peter & John heal the crippled beggar.

In Acts 4: They were arrested and forbidden from proclaiming the name of Jesus in Acts 4:13-22, but they refuse to bow, and the people are rallying to their support for the Lame Man had been known by the crowd for 40 years. They gave all credit & glory to THE LORD!

The believers are filled with more boldness and begin to share their possessions and preach with more boldness. THE NUMBERS ARE GROWING DAILY.

<u>In Acts 5:</u> The High Priest and establishment imprison, threatens, and flogs the disciples and instead of being dejected they left blessed to be worthy of such flogging.

In Acts 6: They are having growing pains, so they broke the work down assigning 7 Deacons to supervise the care of the church, and the Apostles continued teaching and preaching the Word. The early church had all kinds of growth issues—Great Problems to Have!

In Acts 7: In a move of desperation, a Pharisee named Saul attempts to squelch the movement by Killing one of the deacons STEVEN. He is killed, but the actions don't squelch instead it spreads. The action sends the disciples off into Judea, Samaria and beyond. It doesn't squelch the rebellion, it starts HOME GROUPS, HOME CHURCHES EVERYWHERE. And that which was meant to defeat-catalyzed its growth.

In Acts 8: THE CHURCH HAD A MIGHTY VICTORY:

Acts 8:1-4 nkjv

Saul was one of the official witnesses at the killing of Stephen.

A great wave of persecution began that day, sweeping over the church in Jerusalem, and all the believers except the apostles fled into Judea and Samaria. ² (Some godly men came and buried Stephen with loud weeping.) ³ Saul was going everywhere to devastate the church. He went from house to house, dragging out both men and women to throw them into jail.

⁴But the believers who had fled Jerusalem went everywhere preaching the Good News about Jesus.

<u>In Acts 9:</u> Saul is converted and becomes THE APOSTLE TO THE GENTILES, and then the rest is History.

Our very Church today is a by-product of the Prototype Church: "We are a product of that first Revival!" The question to us today is "Will the revival continue?"





In other words "He modeled for them the behaviors He wanted to see in them. When dealing with our children, we often hear that character is caught, not taught." (pg. 134)

"Jesus is the best example of what it means to be a great coach. He gave us a picture of real discipleship that works. Unlike many pastors today, Jesus knew that you cannot disciple in mass numbers. Yes, He spoke to the crowds, but He took His disciples aside and taught them in a relational way. Discipleship is a process that can only be accomplished through relationship. Jesus was the master of effective education. He taught in a small group." (Church as a Team Sport, Pg. 131)

- e. Putman's Model of Determining Spiritual Phase with the Phrase:
 - a. Introduction: Real Life Ministries with Pastor Jim
 Putman came up with a way to help leaders better
 understand where people are in their faith journey.
 They termed it "Phrase from the Phase." In short
 people say things that give us good indicators of where
 they are in their spiritual journey, and through
 understanding their phrase we can help people move
 along their journey to becoming Discipleship-Phase
 leaders.

b. Putman says, "Some are not Christians, but God is drawing them. (In Wesleyan terms they are in the Prevenient Grace Stage.) Some gave their lives to Jesus at some point but have never been disciples, so they are very immature in their faith. Others are Christians who are struggling and need encouragement; still others are Christians who need to learn a lesson. The key is to determine who needs what." (pg. 146 italics my addition or emphasis)

f. Seeker-Level people: There are 2 varieties. (146-148)

a. ______- Need to hear the Gospel. They need to have people walk them through God's plan of Salvation. They need answers to questions and may need Biblical Apologetics for faith so they can find out what it means to be a Christian.

In each of these cases, we can know that they have never accepted the Gospel Message that Jesus Christ is the Lord and Savior of their lives because "Unsaved Seeker-level people" use phrases like:

- "I don't believe in the Bible,"
- "I believe Jesus is a way to get to heaven, but He is not the only way",
- "I went to church when I was young, but Christians were mean to my family, so we never went back."
- "What do I need to be saved for? I am as good as anyone else."
- "Why does God allow bad things to happen?"

knowledge and the new believer habits of prayer, study, fellowship, and witness. They need someone to begin to show them how to understand God's will for them as Christian's.

Saved Seeker-level people who have accepted Jesus as Savior, as the Son of God, but may not understand yet their relationship to other believers and the Church of Jesus Christ use phrases like:

- "I love Jesus, but my church is in the mountains [meadows, nature] because I feel close to God there,"
- "I have been hurt too many times by believers to let them get too close to me,"
- "My accountability is God."
- OR ONE I HEAR SO OFTEN: "I am too busy at work to get connected."
- **g. Connect-Level People: (149)** This stage represents the current stage of the largest amount of believers in the fourstage process.

Connect-level people are found in groups led by
Discipleship-level persons. "If the group is functioning
correctly, these groups act like little churches. People learn
from one another and love each other while helping to take
care of the needs in the group." (148-149)
People at this level are there because "they want to be a
part of something or because they are still working from a
works-salvation mind-set." (149) They are serving typically
from with "me" perspectives and motives. At this level they

are working through how they will be involved and how the gospel includes them. This is a normal stage in our discipleship process but not the Lord's end goal. Remember the disciples argued over who would be the greatest and who would sit at Jesus' right hand in the Kingdom. (Matthew 20:20-28 & Luke 22:24-30)

This is a far cry from the final worries these same later Spirit-filled Disciples or Disciple-phase followers of Jesus would encounter later. As you can see from Acts 4 & 5, they are not even thinking about who sits where, just how great it is to be found worthy to suffer like their Jesus. (Acts 4:13-22 & Acts 5:22-40)

Connect-Level People are very self-orientated in their perspective and are permeated with a "me" mentality. There phrases will repeatedly us the pronoun "I":

- "I love my group"
- "I have never felt so loved."
- "I have finally found home."

Everyone has to go through this Connect-phase, but those that are clinging to it as the honeymoon wears off will begin to become "I" critical. If not careful, and if they don't continue to grow in their faith, they can become very high maintenance and costly to good Biblical growth cycles. Some phrases that indicate that "I" critical level can be:

- "The leaders better not try to split my group— I was just starting to get comfortable here."
- "I had to walk a hundred yards to get into church last Sunday.

 It made me so mad."

- "I was working in the nursery (or just fill in the ______), but they don't appreciate me there, so I think I am going to quit."
- "I am not comfortable at that church. There are far too many people?"
- h. Ministry-Level People: At the Ministry level the huge threshold is crossed from being centered on Me", "My" & "I" to being centered on "OTHERS."

Ministry-level people focus primarily on giving God the Glory with their actions. At this level serving is the very heart of their witness. And motivation is sparked out of graciousness for what the Lord has done for them and can do for "others." At this level there is a desire and drive to go deeper in the Word, to be better equipped to do ministry and to apprentice under Disciple-level leaders. Finally, instead of seeing the church as a means to serve them, they see their gifts, talents and faith as a tool to serve the Lord and His Body. Ministry-level people are becoming "OTHER" centered in their language. When someone new comes in they are the ones that go over to the table and sit down with them or invite them to the group. They don't talk about themselves in their groups, they are talking about others! They are becoming givers rather than takers. This does not mean they don't get their feelings hurt, they are human after all, but they don't let their "me" thinking dominate their walk, they have truly died to Christ. (This is evidence of what John Wesley called Sanctifying Grace.) Some phrases they use are:

them and drop it by."

We see the Apostle Paul doing this in his letters to Timothy and Titus. He spoke to saying simply "Do what you have seen me do!" Paul who was trained by Barnabas, is now training others to be like Him. At this level you move from being in the group or apprenticing in the group to being able to lead a group to being one who disciples others.

People who are moving from the ministry phase to this new Disciple-level ministry will use phrases like:

- "Who can I get to help me reach more people in this ministry?"
- "Have you noticed _____? He is really talented and loves the Lord and is great with those kids; he should be using those gifts to serve God."
- "I was going to the Hospital tonight to pray for a couple of people, and I am thinking about taking George with me. He is so compassionate and loves to pray, and if he goes with me, I know he would enjoy it!"

Discipleship-level persons have a passion to share their joy of serving with others by giving them the opportunity to experience God in this same way.

Small Group: Opening Text John 10:1-16

"Most assuredly, I say to you, he who does not enter the sheepfold by the door, but climbs up some other way, the same is a thief and a robber. ²But he who enters by the door is the sheepherd of the sheep. ³To him the doorkeeper opens, and the sheep hear his voice; and he <u>calls</u> his own sheep by name and leads them out. ⁴And when he brings out his own sheep, he goes before them; and the sheep follow him, for they know his voice. ⁵Yet they will by no means follow a stranger, but will flee from him, for they do not know the voice of strangers." ⁶Jesus used this illustration, but they did not understand the things which He spoke to them.

- d. The Dynamics of a Healthy Shepherding System is like that of a Healthy Water System. In the water world there are.
 - a. <u>Cisterns:</u> Man-made and Land-made areas that can hold water reserves. Healthy Cisterns require use and fresh supply. While unhealthy and cracked cisterns are stagnant and can contaminate and even worse destroy life.

- b. ______: Some sources of water are literally Dead or Dying Seas. In these cases, the water input is dramatically is below demand. In some cases, there is no demand, just shrinkage. And some of these seas are in areas where the climate exasperates the matter and is actually increasing the water loss. As a result, water quality is increasingly changing; concentration levels are even becoming lethal and even toxic.
- c. ______: Is a healthy water supply that has water coming in and water going out. If no water continuously comes in, then the lake dries up. If a lake has water coming in but no water going out, then the lake floods and kills everything around it. But a healthy living water source has balance.

e. The Words of the Prophet Jeremiah should guide us:

Jeremiah 2:13 nlt

For my people have done two evil things: They have forsaken me—the fountain of living water. And they have dug for themselves cracked cisterns that can hold no water at all!

If we step back from the source? The Church will have no fresh-living water coming in, and in due season we will begin to dry up. Sometime in a survivalist mentality churches will attempt to hoard and ration the remaining water, not offering it for ministry but holding it in tanks for their own use to survive a little longer. But look what happens, the reserved water becomes stagnant like the water in an old


fish tank, and it becomes lethally deadly in due season! Why because the Church of Jesus Christ was designed not to function as a Cistern but as the source of "Living Water" that the World might know JESUS.




- f. Group Conversation describing what a Cistern, Dead Sea and Living Water Church might look like!

(REVIEW)

Section I:

"A Brief Review of Methodist History & Theology."

1. John Wesley (1703-1791)

Childhood: John Wesley was born in 1703 in Epworth, England. His father was an Anglican priest named Samuel. His mother, Susanna, was a strong, intelligent woman; she was raised in the puritan tradition and was a very spiritually fervent woman who raised their family in a tradition of Christian service and worship. At age 5, John narrowly escaped death in a house fire. His mother thereafter thought him especially set apart by God- "a brand plucked from the burning." John was 1 of 19, over half died before reaching maturity.

Education: In 1714, at age 11, Wesley was sent away to school in London and later, at 17, to Christ Church College, Oxford. There he proved to be an excellent student, particularly gifted in languages and theology. When he was 23, he was appointed a fellow of Lincoln College, Oxford. In 1728, at age 25, Wesley was ordained a priest of the Church of England.

Methodism: Shortly after his ordination, John joined his younger brother Charles and other Oxford students who had formed a religious society, The Holy Club, dedicated to personal devotion and service to the poor. They tried to achieve order and method in their habit of prayer, discussion, and social ministry. Other students in jest called them the "Bible Moths" and the "Methodists." Wesley and his followers adopted the latter name as a badge of honor.

Seeking Faith: Wesley did not yet feel that his disciplined life of holy actions would assure his salvation. He decided to preach the Gospel to the Indians, hoping to come to understand it better. He sailed to the colony of Georgia in 1735 and spent two disappointing years as a frontier missionary. Feeling he had lost his faith in God, Wesley returned to England. There he began to worship with a very devout German Christian Society (the Moravians).

Conversion: At a prayer meeting in London on May 24, 1738, Wesley had a climatic experience of Christ:

"I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ alone for salvation; and an assurance was given me that He had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death."

Wesley went on to share this new love in his heart with the people throughout England. Wesley's England was in terrible need of Spiritual Renewal.

2. Wesley's Ministry: He sought to provide an answer by providing an Evangelical Mission to the people. Wesley's message was, "Salvation is for everyone and can be found through Jesus. A new life awaits anyone who loves Christ, repents of sins, believes in saving grace and follows His example." Wesley preached in the church, byways, and highways of Europe, preaching outdoors and on stones outside of the mines as the workers would come from the mines. Wesley's heart was extra sensitive to those with no contact with the church. During his years of ministry, Wesley traveled some 250,000 miles on horseback giving more than 40,000 sermons. John's younger brother Charles was always a supporter and partner in his ministry and is responsible for writing over 4000 hymns, such as "Hark the Herald Angels Sing."

- 3. **Wesley's Social Gospel:** Wesley worked his whole life to renew the Church of England and extend its reach to the churchless masses. John Wesley preached social holiness. Methodists have long supported:
 - <u>Education-</u> Many local Methodist Societies sponsored schools. Wesley himself ran a school for orphans at Kingswood. He also wrote many educational texts and revised others for general use. Duke, Emory, SMU, Vanderbilt, McKendree, Illinois Wesleyan, many, many colleges, seminaries, and medical schools are of Methodist origin.
 - Abolition of Slaverycalling it "the scandal of religion, of England and of human nature." He gave many sermons on its evils.
 - Medical Assistance Wesley ran medical dispensaries for the
 poor in several English cities. He wrote and published a
 handbook for medical home care. Methodists operate
 hundreds of Hospitals, Nursing homes, Retirement villages
 and other institutions throughout the World.
- 4. Methodism in AMERICA: Around 1760 a movement lead by lay Methodist missionaries to the America began developing parishes around the Maryland and Virginia areas. As the American Methodist movement grew, and there were almost no Anglican priests available, the church cried for ordained clergy to carry out the sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper. The Methodist movement grew until the war for independence made it hard for Wesley, an English Tory, to maintain relations with his American Methodist cousins. Wesley sent Thomas Coke to America as a superintendent with orders to make Francis Asbury an additional superintendent to supervise the work of the Methodists in America. Both Asbury

and Coke, as ordained clergy, would supervise the sacraments. Wesley also sent a prayer book titled, "The Sunday Service of the Methodists in North America." his revision of the Church of England's 39 Articles of Religion. In 1784, at the famous Christmas Conference of Methodist preachers held in Baltimore at Lovely Lane Chapel, the American Methodist movement organized officially as the Methodist Episcopal Church in America. In some way or another that original church has continued to this day. For over 30 years Coke and Asbury served as the bishops. The first American born Bishop was Bishop William McKendree.

Section II. Major Points of Wesleyan Doctrine

- 1. As people of the Methodist Way, we share in the **Apostolic** witness to Jesus Christ as Savior & Lord.
- 2. As people of the Methodist Way, we accept as part of our identity:
 - 1) The <u>Cannon of Scripture</u> found in the <u>39</u> Books of the OT and <u>27</u> Books of the NT.
 - 2) Ecumenical Creeds from Nicaea as well as The Apostles
 Creed. (These Creeds have set the boundaries for acceptable Christian Doctrine.)
 - 3) As people of the Methodist Way, we became a part of the Protestant Reformation of the 16th & 17th Century. This movement "sought to reclaim authentic biblical witness. These documents affirm the primacy of scripture and provided format for doctrinal standards through their statements of essential beliefs on matters such as the way of Salvation, the Christians life, and the nature of the Church." (pg. 42, Para 101, 2004 UM Discipline)

- 4) As people of the Methodist Way, we spring from the loins of The Church of England and share in their doctrinal heritage.
- **5)** The Methodist movement began as a <u>renewal movement</u> within the Church of England. The movement sought a return to Christian Holiness by living out in a practical way, "The Scriptural Way of Salvation." (pg. 45)
- 6) The Wesleyan Way has a clear "Ordo of Salutis" or "Order of
 - Salvation": It follows that God's grace and love is always with us. While the grace of God is undivided, it precedes salvation as "Prevenient grace," continues in "Justifying grace," and is brought to fruition in "Sanctifying grace" and achieves

By GRACE_we mean "the undeserved, unmerited, and loving action of God in human existence through the ever-present Holy Spirit." (pg. 45)


its perfection in "Glorifying grace." The definitions of Wesley's four means of Grace make it clear that as Wesleyan's, we believe that the Grace of God is ever present with us:

- i. Prevenient Grace- "The First Slight Transient Conviction."
- **ii.** <u>Justifying or Convincing Grace</u>- The point where we confess our sins, accept God's pardoning love. "We become Children of God."
- iii. Sanctifying Grace- is about seeking Christian Perfection. It is the Grace of God in seeking to have one's own heart per Wesley to be "habitually filled with the Love of God and neighbor" and as "having the mind of Christ and walking as he walked." (pg. 47)

iv. Glorifying Grace- The Grace that leads us home into the

Presence of the Almighty, transforming us into God's perfect will for our lives.

This grace most often comes to us in death, but Wesley considered this a state of entire sanctification.




- 7) Faith & Good Works- Wesley believed "repentance should be accompanied by 'Fruit meet for repentance,' of works of piety and mercy." (pg. 47)
- 8) Mission & Service- "Personal Salvation always involves

 Christian mission & service to the world." Our faith cannot be real unless it is holiness in action through our worship inside the walls and our service outside the walls. Wesley called this "Social Holiness." (pg. 48)
- 9) The Early Methodist Societies had a very simple term for membership: "a desire to flee from the wrath to come and to be saved from their sins." (pg. 48)
- 10) Wesley felt evangelical living should be lived out to three simple rules. Wesley wrote:
 - i. FIRST: "By doing no harm, by avoiding evil of every kind."
 - ii. SECOND: "By doing good of every possible sort, and, as far as possible, to all."
 - iii. THIRD: "By attending upon all the ordinances of God"- In short Stay in Love with God!

- 11) The Wesleyan Way calls for us to better understand the Bible and our Church using what is known as "The Wesleyan Quadrilateral." It breaks down to:
 - 1. Scripture
 - 2. Tradition

- 3. Reason
- 4. Experience
- i. The Wesleyan Way holds that Scripture, tradition, experience, and reason are sources and norms for belief and practice but that the Bible is primary among them.
- ii. Scripture provides us with God's Words, illustrations, and stories. Sometimes these texts make clear-cut inferences to modern day dilemmas, but in some cases, it requires us to add in the tradition of the Church, the experiences of our lives and cultures and to even use logic and reason to complete the process of using the Bible as our guide for determining our beliefs and practices. It is my belief, and the Wesleyan belief, stated in the Methodist Articles of Religion, that Scripture contains "all things necessary for salvation." (The 2004 UM Book of Discipline, pg. #59.) The Wesleyan Quadrilateral goes on to inform us on how to read these Sacred Texts in the light of modernity.
- iii. Yes, there are four main categories that should inform our beliefs and practices, and as there are four, all should play a role in that decision. But only one of the four categories is



given the respect of a big "S- Scripture." As such, four sides support the Wesleyan Quadrilateral, but it is not an equilateral quadrilateral. (NOT A SQUARE)

" " was Wesley's term for salvation: In other words what are the marks of the Christian life? In the Wesleyan tradition, the greatest mark is the "Witness of the Spirit." This is the knowledge, the certification, that we are children of God. Romans 8:16 say, "The Spirit itself bears witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God." The most important mark is the one inside our hearts and minds that tells us we are a child of God, an heir to the Kingdom of God. With this knowledge comes the by-product that the Spirit of God brings in those that believe. This starts with an inward knowledge of God's love and grace. It is witnessed to through the development of the fruits of the Spirit and through our openness to God's gifts, graces, and talents in our life. The Christian, in living a life consistent with the "life" of Christ", seeks to please God and by living out the teachings of the Bible. Living a life that focuses on a love for God equaled by a love for our neighbors. The Christian will seek to do those things that glorify God, and bring honor to the Kingdom, including being a good employee or employer, a good spouse, a good parent, a good neighbor, and a good citizen. The mark of the Christian life is ultimately the inner peace that comes from knowing that Jesus Christ is the Lord and Savior of one's life.


⁷ Then he showed me another vision. I saw the Lord standing beside a wall that had been built using a <u>plumb line</u>. He was checking it with <u>a plumb line to see if it was straight.</u> ⁸ And the LORD said to me, "Amos, what do you see?" I answered, "A plumb line."

And the Lord replied, "I will test my people with this plumb line. I will no longer ignore all their sins. ⁹ The pagan shrines of your ancestors and the temples of Israel will be destroyed, and I will bring the dynasty of King Jeroboam (King of Israel) to a sudden end." [()-my emphasis added]

The Plumb Line is God's Standard for our Righteousness or Holiness- which means our walk according to the Lord's Holy Way for His People! It provides us what every Biblically Functioning Faithful Follower of Jesus Christ needs to know to be an effective Disciple.

What is a DISICPLE? It is a noun which means: one who accepts and assists in spreading the doctrines of another, in this case, the doctrines of Jesus Christ. A disciple is someone who is "A convinced adherent of a school or individual."

It is important to note the two-sided responsibility of a disciple. They "ACCEPT" the doctrine AND they "ASSIST IN SPREADING" the doctrine. As a modern church we are failing horribly at the latter half of this two-sided responsibility, and we are very marginal in meeting the "Plumb" of the former. Remember in a VERTICLE STRUCTURE there are two axis's the E-W



and N-S. We as disciples must have both Axis's aligned to be "Plumb."

2. The Master Builder: "Who is God? Who are we?"



 - 2. God is <u>HOLY.</u> (Note: The three-fold "Holy, Holy, Holy" indicating the Trinitarian aspects of God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit.) In a great chorus they sang: "Holy, Holy, Holy is the LORD Almighty, the whole earth is filled with His glory. (Isaiah 6:3)
 - 3. God is <u>JUST</u>. The Lord is known for His Justice. (Psalm 9:16a) & I will take the measuring line of justice and the plumb line of righteousness to check the foundation wall you have built. (Isaiah 28:17)
- c. One of the greatest PARADOXES OF THE CHRISTIAN FAITH is found in the

TRANSCENDENT side and IMMANENT side of God.

- i. God is Transcendent. (A BIG WORD FOR HOLY!)
- ii. God is Immanent. (A BIG
 WORD FOR APPROACHABLE or
 PERSONAL NATURE OF GOD)

The 10 Second Prayer of Salvation!



6. **Styling It:** "From the Upper Room to a place called Azusa Street"

We share in the <u>Apostolic witness</u> to Jesus Christ as Savior & Lord. It took so many faithful servants of God to get the witness of the Apostles from Step 1 to us today in Step 7. Those 7 Steps are:

- i. The Apostolic Age (33-312)
- ii. The State Church (313-603)
- iii. The Papal Church which includes the Dark Ages (604-1517)
- iv. The Protestant Reformation (1517-1700)
- v. Holiness Age (1700-1904)
- vi. Azusa Street Revival & Pentecostal Age (1904-1915)
- vii. The Charismatic Renewal (1969-Present)

We are a by-product of The Protestant Reformation of the 16th with an undoubtedly Arminian and Wesleyan Holiness Twist, add to that a fresh dose of Pentecost with the baptism of the Holy Ghost from Azusa Street and a supped-up laity turbocharged radically for Jesus through the modern-day Charismatic Renewal.


- 7. The Big House: "The Church- It's Nature, Mission and Power."
 - **Q.** Troy's Definition: <u>WHAT IS THE CHURCH?</u> It is a TEAM, <u>A Community of Faith</u>, who is <u>growing faithful followers of Christ</u>. These followers are commissioned by Christ to be His witnesses, His body, His team on earth in order to fulfill the Great Commission. When two or more gather in the name of Christ- the church is in session!
 - **b.** The Model for The Church is found in the ACTS PROTOTYPE: Acts 1-9
 - 1. A **PERSONAL RELATIONSHIP** WITH JESUS.
 - 2. THEY HAD A **PASSION** FOR HIS NAME.
 - 3. THEY CARRIED THE **HOLY SPIRIT** WITH THEM.
 - 4. THEY PRESSED ON OUT OF A GREATER FEAR OF **FAILING THEIR LORD**THAN OF THE SECULAR WORLD.
 - 5. THEIR WILL AND DESIRE TO <u>NEVER GIVE UP</u> IS WHAT MADE THEM CHAMPIONS FOR THE LORD.
 - 6. AND IT WAS THEIR COMMITMENT TO THE GOSPEL THAT ADDED THOUSANDS TO THEIR CHURCH DAILY AND SPUN OFF HOUSE CHURCHES ACROSS THE WORLD AND TO THIS VERY DAY!
- 8. **Assessment Tools:** "Determining Spiritual Phase with the Phrase."

So, four things define a disciple:

- **1. First,** *a disciple is one who has made* **Jesus the Lord of his or her life.** Jesus said, "Come and follow me." He is the leader. We must be committed to being the followers.
- **2. Second,** a disciple is one who has entered a process of <u>relational discipleship</u> with other maturing Christians.
- 3. Third, a disciple is one who is becoming Christ-like.
- **4. Finally,** a disciple is one who is committed to the **mission of Christ.**

Four phases or stages of the Discipleship Process: (You cannot get to one phase without the previous.)

- a. Seeker Phase-
- b. Connect Phase-
- c. Minister Phase-
- d. Disciple Phase-




9. Building Dynamics: "Shepherding & Flock Dynamics"

- a. Shepherding & Flock Dynamics:
 - a. Preaching takes place in the larger community at the Ranch Level for us this is the Local Church. (There is a catalyst that occurs in the corporate worship experience. It is in this experience that the Holy Spirit anoints and inhabits the preaching moment for its maximum impact.)
 - b. <u>Teaching</u> takes place at the <u>Herd</u> level and for us this is within the Local Church. (There is another experience of corporate learning that takes place in the dynamic experience of a teaching moment to groups of hungry disciples.)
 - c. Shepherding/Pastoring is the discipleship that takes place at the Flock level within the Local Church. (The very heartbeat of the church comes in the small group. It is in the flock where people come together, they are called, they are known & know, and support one-another through the Share-Connect-Ministry-Disciple phases of their walk with God.)
- b. THE IMPORTANTCE OF THE SOURCE- GOD AND HIS PLAN FOR THE CHURCH ILLUSTRATED BY: Dead Sea Churches, Cistern Churches, and Living Water Churches:

If we step back from the source? The Church will have no fresh-living water coming in, and in due season we will begin to dry up. Sometime in a survivalist mentality, a church will attempt to hoard and ration the remaining water, not offering it for ministry but holding it in tanks for their own use to survive a little longer. But look what happens, the reserved water becomes stagnant like the water in an old fish tank, and it becomes lethally deadly in due season! Why because the Church of Jesus Christ was designed not to function as a Cistern but as the source of "Living Water" that the World might know JESUS.

c. Dynamic Death and Dynamic Growth illustrated by the Bell Curve and the S-Curve Solution: (The law of diminishing returns verses the law of momentum.)



A Healthy Flock has new sheep, adolescent sheep, and mature sheep all under the leadership of under-Shepherds. As a result, new flocks are born. And a Healthy and Productive system means the Ranch is growing. (Ranching on the S-Curve)

If we fail to grow and produce healthy flocks, than they become stagnant and aging leading to decline and death. (Ranching on the Bell-Curve)

"Spiritual Gifts & The Spiritual Health of the Leader"



- a. Three indicators help you maintain your OPTIMUM SPIRITUAL HEALTH AS A LEADER: *Taken from Networking by Bill Hybels.
 - 1. Passion Indicates WHERE you will be best suited to serve. "I Have a Passion for _____."
 - Spiritual Gifts- Indicate WHAT you will do when you serve God. (Wisdom, Knowledge, Faith, healing, Miracles, Prophecy, Discernment of Spirits, Tongues, Interpretation, Apostleship, Teaching, Heals or Service, Administration, Encouragement/Exhortation, Giving, Leadership, Mercy, Evangelism, Pastor/Shepherding, Hospitality, Craftsmanship, Prayer/Intercession, Worship/Music & others.
 - 3. <u>Personal Style-</u> Indicates <u>HOW</u> you will serve. There are two spectrums to look at in determining your personal style in serving the Lord. There is the <u>ENERGIZED SPECTRUM</u> & the <u>ORGANIZED SPECTRUM</u>.
- b. When these three indicators are put together, they give us a good indicator of how to build our ministry walk to the CODE that God has placed within us. It is within this code that we will be the most fulfilled and satisfied in living our life PLUMB to God's will for each of us.


